Lactify- Nourishing New Beginning

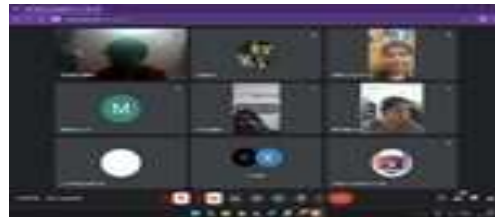
